



## ENGLAND HOCKEY ON-LINE WELFARE COURSES

### Introduction

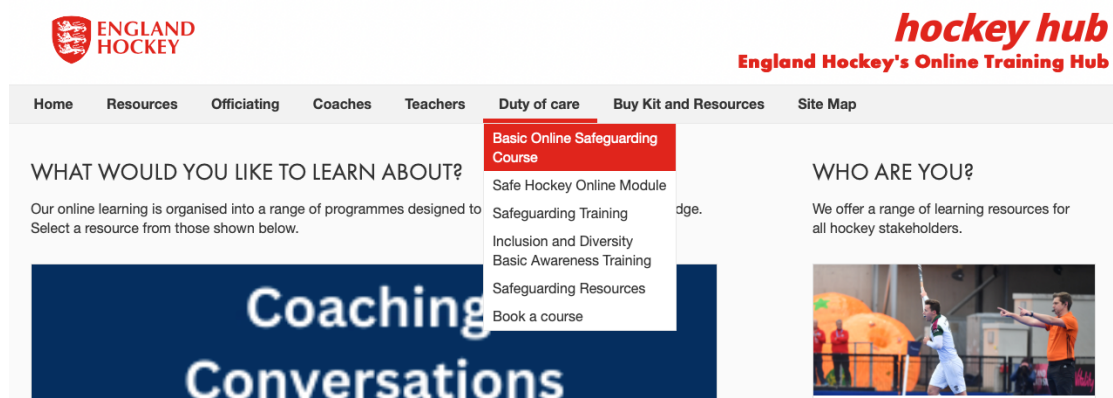
1. This document provides information on how to complete the England Hockey (EH) On-line courses:
  - a. Basic Online **Safeguarding** Course.
  - b. **Inclusion** and Diversity Basic Awareness Training.
  - c. **Safe Hockey** Online Module
2. The courses consisting of learning package followed by a test. On successful completion of the module/test you will be able to download a certificate in .PDF format: Please forward a copy of the certificate by e-mail to the Club Safeguarding Officer or Club Chair for club records.
3. These course are valid for 3 years and should be renewed before the due date.

### Registering on the EH Hockey Hub

4. To be able to complete these courses you need to register on the EH Hockey Hub.
5. To access the Hockey Hub click on the link on the Club website:

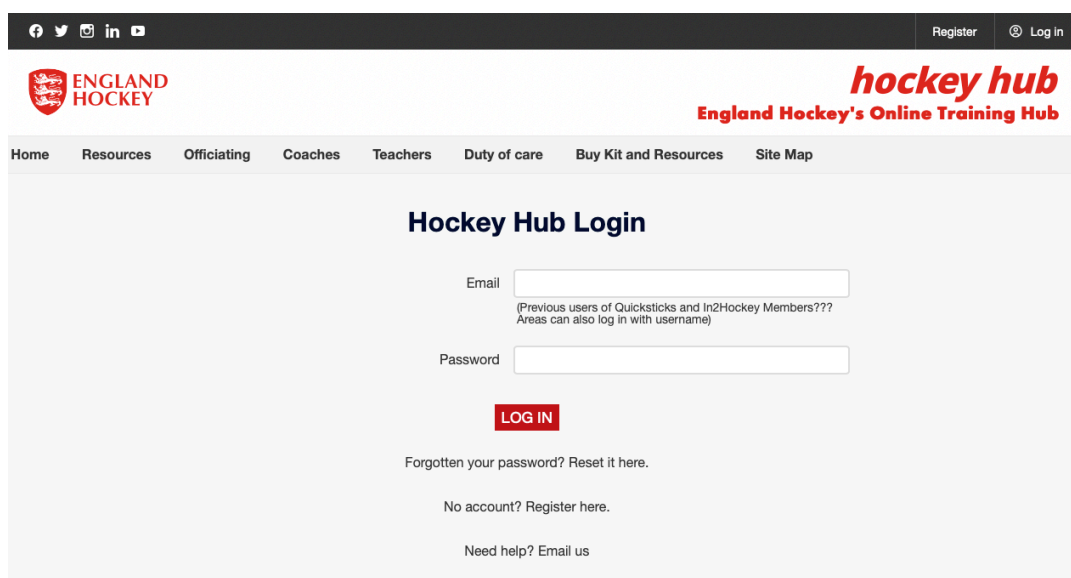

7. You will need to register to create an account.

8. Alternatively you can click on “Log-in” or “Register” at the top right of the screen.



9. Once you have logged-in the hockey hub page will come-up and you can again select “Duty of Care” on the menu bar and click on the relevant course to start your training.

### Cost

10. Please note that while there is nil cost for the Inclusion and Safe Hockey modules, you will be charged for the Safeguarding course. The Club has purchased voucher codes from Hockey Hub that can be redeemed against online training courses and resources: Please use the code supplied by the Club to pay. Should the voucher not work, please contact the Club Chair or Club Treasurer who will arrange for more credit.

## Safeguarding

11. Selecting “Basic Online Training Course” will bring-up the relevant training page: You can start learning by clicking on the **Start Learning** button.
