LEVEL TWO CERTIFICATE IN COACHING HOCKEY

INFORMATION

The Qualification

This qualification, delivered in partnership with 1st4sport Qualifications (Awarding Body), gives an externally accredited qualification that sits on the National Qualifications Framework. The Level Two Award is for those coaches who wish to coach the techniques of the game beyond an introductory level and apply them to tactical play and the coaching of teams. It is only suitable for those with experience of coaching hockey.

Those accredited at Level Two will be able to coach the full range of techniques and skills in the modern game and to lead a group of coaches in delivering a programme in a safe and enjoyable way.

The Course Content (see pages 2-4)

The course involves a minimum of 28 hours of tutored pitch-time and theory work. A further 6 hours of practical coaching, some of which will ideally be mentored, will take place following the course and prior to assessment.

For the mentored coaching you will require an experienced Level Two Coach (or above). If you know of anyone who is suitable please seek his/her permission and bring his/her details to the first session.

Candidates will also need to attend some mandatory courses run by sports coach UK (scUK), have a First Aid certificate, are strongly advised to be CRB checked and have up-to-date insurance cover.

The Assessments

Candidates will have two practical assessments - one with adults and one with children (under 16 years). Each assessment will be of 30 minutes duration coaching at least 16 players. The candidate will be required to demonstrate the coaching of technical skills and game related play.

The Portfolio

Candidates will be required to complete a full and detailed portfolio, which is task-based. Much of this work will be completed during the theory parts of the course programme.

The Portfolio will include evidence of:

- Gathering information – including risk assessments and incident forms
- Roles, skills, qualities and ethical values
- Fitness for hockey
- Coaching styles and effective communication
- Planning coaching sessions and evaluating them

Additional evidence should be collated for your portfolio (only photocopies required):

1. Any certificates e.g. Level One Coach Award, Teaching Certificate, Umpiring Award
2. Current First Aid certificate **
3. Safeguarding & Protecting Children Workshop (scUK) **
4. CRB check/disclosure
5. Any sports coach UK (scUK) Workshop certificates
6. Insurance certificate

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*** Compulsory. It is recommended that candidates start looking at the availability of local courses as soon as possible. Your local Sports Development Officer or England Hockey Board Development Officer will be able to assist.*

Accreditation

Candidates who are assessed as competent coaching both adults and children, and who submit a coaching portfolio, which meets the required criteria, will be awarded the Level Two Certificate in Coaching Hockey.

Registration Period

The assessments must be completed within 18 months of registration on the course and the portfolio completed and marked within 2 years of registration.

Failure to complete within the 2 year registration period will require the candidate to pay a further £100 for a new registration.

Most candidates should be able to complete the Award within 6 – 9 months of attending the course.

The four days of the course will cover both theory and practical modules.

- holding the stick
- running with the stick in one hand
- running with the stick and ball
- using reverse stick

Attacking Skills

Core Skills

Techniques and tactics:

- carrying the ball and scanning/ pre scan prior to receipt
- relevant PAP on left and right
- eliminating a player – 1 v 1 on open and reverse including 3 D skills and V drags
- passing and receiving on the move
- roll out over left shoulder
- clear out/ pull back
- short and long post for relevant pass
- eliminating a player - 2 v 1 (square and with depth - introduction of small unit play)
- relevant screen lead, or stretched lead – situation dependent
- the push & hit in context
- the slap long handle & hands apart
- introduce the reverse stick hit with edge of stick and reverse stick dink (Hands apart),

NB ensure 2 v 1 includes a marked player

Conditioned Games

Defending Skills

Techniques:

- closing down
- closing straight and chopping stride (deceleration)
- closing down on a curve when appropriate
- channelling, delay and engaging distance
- jab tackle
- open stick tackle
- reverse stick tackle
- shave tackle
- default hand position, defend body space and blocking
- using variety of relevant positions to make tackles

Circle Entry and Goal Scoring

Techniques and tactics:

- shooting early,
- using the hit – open and reverse (change grip) off either foot, short quick backlift
- using the push / flick open and reverse
- rebounding/volleying (hands apart) 1st time close in
- deflecting forehand and reverse
- near circle edge/ close to goal
- changing GK angle on receipt
- on receipt setting ball to side or back space to get shot off
- delivered from variety of receiving angles
- connecting with support player in the circle, shooting across goal, low far post (widen the goal)

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Unit Play in Attack

- width in attack
- support and depth in attack
- leading to penetration with pass or carry
- movement to create space
- unit play 1 v 1, 3 v 2, 4 v 3, 2 v 2, 3 v 3 etc
- hard to space, opening the passing lane
- executing v drag manipulation when defender reaching and running
- Pass and lead through (get ahead)
- Connections between ball carrier and potential receiver

Unit Play in Defence

Skills and tactics:

- Jump back
- body position / line of sight / narrow and broad attentional focus
- depth/ cover
- control, restraint and patience
- balance in defence/ role of help side
- understanding of basic zonal, man for man defending
- intercepting
- double team 1 v 2 & 2 v 3
- Defending in zones of the pitch
- Plus attackers defending the 16 year hit etc
- Transition play

Goalkeeping

Techniques and tactics:

Position of readiness

Saving the ball using kickers and leg guards

- Kit
- save clear using the kickers and leg guards
- diving techniques
- positioning (narrow the angle) to receive a shot
- movement across the goal
- saving using the hands and stick
- smothering and secondary saves
- combination saves
- basic Penalty Corner techniques

The Basic Set plays

Skills and tactics:

- self pass / free-hits
- hit outs
- side line ball/ corners
- centre pass
- free hits 5 m circle edge
- penalty corners – attack and defence
- penalty strokes
